

Managing Time
Titus 1:7
Sermon Discussion Questions
November 10, 2019

1. This Sunday's sermon was on time. Many of us feel like we don't have enough time in a given day while still others feel that they have more time on their hands than they know what to do with. Do either of these extremes resonate with you and your current season of life?
2. Pastor Jim mentioned the similarities between time and money, so much so that there is a very famous proverb that says "time is money." Have you ever viewed time in the same light as you view money? The goal of our sermon series in Titus is to produce self-controlled, godly lives. Have you struggled in the area of self-control as it relates to your time?
3. Pastor Jim lays out two types of time: set time (referring to seasons, assignments and situations set for us by God) and spending time (referring to days, weeks and months). Was it beneficial to understand the differences? Discuss these and how they relate to one another. Discuss different seasons you have been in or assignments you have had or you may currently have. How did spending time relate to these set times?
4. Are you, or someone you know, currently in a difficult set time? This morning we heard a very impactful testimony from Linda, a woman who has been diagnosed with terminal cancer. How did hearing her testimony encourage you in how you spend your time during the current season you may be in? How can you encourage someone you may know who is in a difficult season in how they are spending their time?
5. What were your thoughts when Jim mentioned a time budget? Would this be helpful for you to consider in your life?
6. Spend some time praying through the use of time in your life. Ask the Spirit to convict you of way you have made time an idol in your life or ways you have allowed time to be your master. Ask for forgiveness for ways you have wasted the set times God has placed in your life. Ask the Spirit to help you differentiate between set time from the Lord as opposed to self-appointed set times. Ask God to allow you to focus on your spending time as it relates to the set times He has placed in your life.
