Worship Revelation 15

Sermon Discussion Questions February 28, 2021

Special Note: In light of Revelation 1:3, please read the passage for this week's study questions aloud as a group before going through the questions.

- 1. Revelation 15 is all about the idea of worship. While the sermon primarily focused on worship as singing, what are some other ways you worship outside of the gathered assembly?
- 2. In Revelation 15:1-2, John describes martyrs from all nations who died for the same faith in Jesus that you hold to today. In what ways do you find it difficult to be a Christian in today's current (political, cultural, etc.) climate?
- 3. The first way Pastor Jim mentions we worship is through music and song. The first worship song we see in Scripture is the song of Moses from Exodus 15. We see a similar version in our passage today in Revelation 15. Read aloud both versions of the Song of Moses, what are the differences between the two? What is the significance of this as it pertains to worship?
- 4. Another way we worship is through declaring God's perfect character. Is there a work, family or friend situation that you can think of that has caused you to reflect more on God's character? (Example: In Revelation 12:11, the martyrs were willing to die for Jesus because they trusted in God's righteous and holy character)
- 5. We all struggle sometimes to see God's righteous acts or feel the truth about God's character 24/7. Spend some time praying for one another that even in tough situations we'd be able to sing songs of praise in faith throughout the coming week.
- 6. *Creative Assignment:* If you were to compare Exodus 14 to Exodus 15, they both describe the same event in the parting of the Red Sea. Exodus 14 is a narrative of the event while Exodus 15 is a poem/song describing the event. Think of the latest battle God has won in your life. Take some time this week to sit down and write out the events in poetic or song form.
