

The Last Words of Revelation

Revelation 22:6-21

Sermon Discussion Questions

April 25, 2021

Special Note: In light of Revelation 1:3, please read the passage for this week's study questions aloud as a group before going through the questions.

1. As this is the last week in Revelation, share with the group one surprising thing you learned over the course of this series. What sermon, theme or verse from the series sticks out to you?
2. In **Revelation 21:8-9**, we see the last instruction that asks us where the affections of our worship point towards. Are there times where you are defending the opinions and ideologies of others more than Christ and His word? Are there times where your words or thoughts are worshipped more than the words of God?
3. The last promises from verses 12-13, which also appear in verse 7 and 20, share that Jesus is coming soon. Pastor Tom mentioned 2 Peter 3:8-9 to align our timeline line of *soon* with that of Jesus. When you hear that Jesus is coming soon, how does this make you feel? Does this provide security and comfort in what you're enduring, or weariness or despair since soon isn't as quickly as you may desire?
4. Verse 15 shares the last warning of scripture and how all of scripture points to people repenting and believing. What are some warnings from Revelation, other scripture passages or from godly people in your life that you've learned to be true in your life? Was this an experience where you heeded the warning or did you experience the effects of it?
5. Our message this morning was on the last words of Scripture and how they apply to each of us. When thinking of last words and allowing the lives we live to speak for us, what lasting words will be spoken to others based upon your life? Through our time in Revelation, how is the Spirit calling you to change some things in your life to better reflect the image of Christ and His words spoken to us?
6. Spend time praying for one another to that you would live a life of the gospel so that its word and message would be spoken through your life.
