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Funeral Planning: Where to Begin

Thank you for picking up this guide. Whether you or your loved one has received a terminal diagnosis, your loved one has recently passed away, or you simply want to be prepared for when the Lord says your days on earth have ended, God sees you and is with you. As your church family, our staff and pastors would love the opportunity to walk with you through the process of planning your funeral or helping you plan for the funeral of a loved one.

Taking the time to plan a service for yourself or a loved one helps provide peace of mind to all involved, helps give time to create a meaningful and healing celebration of life, and ensures that your wishes are known.

There are a number of questions and details to sift through before or after a death, so it's our hope that this packet will help minimize the grief and stress of planning. We trust the Lord will guide you through each step of the way, and that this guide is part of His process.

Scripture reminds us of God's promise that He is near and that he rescues those suffering from pain and loss. Psalm 34:18 says: "The Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit." Take heart and know that the Lord is walking with you through whatever you are, or will, go through.

Whether we have met in person, seen each other across the sanctuary, or have never met, I'd love to personally hear your story if you're willing to share it and we would love to walk beside you to be a support, a comfort, and a prayer warrior as you prepare for a meaningful and memorable service.

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At the Time of Passing

STEP 1

Contact Emergency Personnel

- If your loved one passed at home, notify emergency personnel by dialing 911.
- If your loved one was under hospice care, you must notify hospice if they were not present at the time of death.
- If your loved one passed in a healthcare facility, the facility will notify the proper authorities. They will also notify the funeral home of your choice.

STEP 2

Contact the funeral home of your choice to establish care with them if your loved one passed away at home. They will help you with the following decisions:

- Making the choice between a burial or cremation
- Choosing the best casket or urn for your loved one
- What type of service you would like to have: funeral home, church service, graveside service, or combination of any of these
- When/if you would like to hold a viewing prior to funeral services or visitation

STEP 3

Family Planning Meeting

Once you have chosen a funeral home to care for your loved one's funeral planning, we invite you to join the Director of Events and Care Ministry staff for a family planning session. During this we will:

- choose a date and time to hold your loved one's funeral
- help choose a minister to perform services
- plan details of visitation and reception times
- make selections for scripture reading and music to be played


This is also a time to recall some of your most cherished memories of your loved one. From early life stories to work history, from their experiences with baptism, coming to know the Lord, and how their retirement years were spent, we will help guide you through sharing what were the most meaningful parts of your loved one's life.

Here are some areas of your loved one's life to consider when preparing for your Family Planning Session:

- Childhood and growing up years
- Education and Career preparation
- Mid-life and Professional Years
- Parents, siblings, best friends, spouse, children, and stories about these individuals
- Funny life stories, serious life stories, work life stories, hobbies, favorite things to do
- Date of salvation and baptism, favorite scriptures and songs, memorable stories of Christianity and how he/she served the Lord

GUIDELINES

- We invite immediate family to join us for these planning meetings, which last approximately 1 to 1.5 hours. These take place at Calvary Church in the Care Ministry wing located at Entrance J.
- These appointments take place during Calvary's business hours of 8:00am to 4:30pm Monday through Friday
- Funerals with less than 300 attendees will take place in Calvary's Chapel
- Funerals with more than 300 attendees may take place in the Sanctuary
- Funeral speakers other than funeral minister have a maximum of 5 minutes to share. A copy of their notes should be turned in no later than 2 days prior to funeral service for review by funeral minister.
- Calvary does not create or print funeral bulletins. Please contact your funeral home for this service.
- You will have access to the building thirty minutes prior to the start of the visitation or funeral services. A family room will be set up for private use.



Visitation Opportunities


While a funeral service is a more formal way to honor your loved one, a visitation is a more relaxed way to welcome friends and family prior to a funeral. At Calvary, visitations take place in the lobby area just outside of the Chapel doors.

There are a number of options to make your visitation a beautiful time of remembrance:

- Photo memory boards on easels
- Video slideshow set to music
- A table with your loved one's personal items (Bible, hobby materials, favorite items, photo books, etc.)
- Floral arrangements
- The choice to have an open-casket viewing is a personal one, and one we invite you to pray through and consider. Some families choose to have the casket present and open, and others choose to have it closed. Or the casket may not be present at all. Alternatively, if your loved one has been cremated, the urn can have a place of honor on a table near the family members who are receiving visitors.

GUIDELINES

- Viewings may take place in the Chapel lobby, if the funeral is taking place in the Chapel.
- If the funeral is taking place in the Sanctuary, the viewing may take place in Crosswalk.
- Seating is available for family members who can not stand for long periods at a time.
- If no casket or urn will be present on-site, a photo of your loved one is a great representation piece to have on a table alongside flowers or other memorabilia.
- Calvary's Production Team does not create slideshows for funerals. If a family member would like to create a slideshow, we would be happy to play it.
- A family room will be provided with coffee and water service during the time of the Visitation.



Reception Planning

Whether you are planning a morning or afternoon funeral, another time to welcome guests is at a post-funeral reception. Calvary has designated spaces for families to hold luncheons or dessert receptions following funeral services. We work with a number of local caterers to offer meals for any price range.

GUIDELINES:

- Receptions may take place in Room 215 (adjacent to the Chapel), if less than 50 attendees; Room 208 (Calvary Students Space) if less than 150 attendees. If group is larger than 150 attendees, the Gathering Place may be used.
- Caterers may access the building through Entrance D on the East side of the building.
- The use of music or playing of a slideshow at a reception needs to be arranged through the Director of Events (contact info on page 3).
- Linens, paper products, coffee and water are all available free of charge from Calvary Church.



Cost Breakdown

Calvary does not charge a fee for the use of our Chapel or Sanctuary for funeral services. There are, however, individuals to whom honorariums are due for their help in funeral programming. Below is the breakdown of costs:

- \$100.00 for each desired Calvary musician (piano, organ, guitar, vocals)
- \$100.00 for each production team member for the operation of sound, lights and slides
- \$150.00 Minimum recommended honorarium for the Minister who conducts services
